

PAST EVENTS

Monday 8th January "Famous Women" There were 12 members present

Martin Farr started the afternoon by showing lots of sheets of Japanese Ladies that were all from the Japanese Letter Writing Week which started in 1948 with the classic `Beauty Looking Back` issue. Japan issued 3 pictures each year and they made a very nice set of pictures of not so famous but lovely Geisha ladies.

Mike Smith was next and he showed sheets of "Queens" from several countries, Then **Dave Tanner** displayed two very nice sheets about Lady Baden Powell. Nice.

Juliet Keel the put up a full board of cards and pictures of famous women through the ages. Ellen Terry, Sarah Bernhardt, Vesta Tilley, Gladys Cooper, and Lilly Langtry just to name a few. She showed p.h.q cards, celebratory ladies and some cards of 2 women of achievement that included Emmeline Pankhurst and Charlotte Bronte. What a great collection of ladies.

To finish the afternoon **Alan Cross** (who had been sorting things out) showed a great collection of letters and cards showing Women of the medical service and lots of cards all about Australian Olympic Gold Medal winners which were very colourful.

And that ended the afternoon session

Thursday 18th January "Recent Acquisitions" 17 Members present

Malcolm Hoskins started the evening by showing Pre-cancels and particularly Montgomery department and variations plus from Oakland Fort Worth and San Francisco.

Graeme Stewart was next and he showed recent items he acquired from the Ross Dependency in Antarctica.

Bob Paterson was next and he showed West Indies stamps with specimens from Barbados and Bermuda, then underpaid postage items from the British Virgin Islands - (KGV set) and the Turks and Caicos Islands and some letters from the Maldive Islands to New York. Quite a comprehensive display!

Colin West then showed Postal Stationery recently purchased from Provincial Auctions and more postal stationery and Wrappers.

Mike Smith was next and he showed recently acquired KGV `Downey Heads` Bechuanaland issues and some nice 1935 Silver Jubilee issues of Bechuanaland.

Jeff Rogers then showed a full 1d red plate 72 from AA to TL Very nice indeed.

John Tingey then displayed cancels of the 1d red of 1854 and colour variations using Maltese Cross cancels

To finish the first part of the evening, **Alan Cross** then showed Australian Postage Due stamps and several covers with these items on them.

Part Two

Brian May was first and he put up a nice series of pre-printed postcards of the 1961 `Silent Night` series from Australia.

Dave Tanner was next and he showed recently acquired Iranian stamps and a very nice large USA Birds and Fauna stamp booklet.

John Mills then showed `Packet Boat` cancellations and some type 19 cancels and also some French `Chocolat` issues. All very tasty!

Barney Bardsley was next - a nice display of QV 1d reds and their perforations – different colours and Maltese Cross cancellations from black to green and various other types of Maltese Cross cancels. Quite a display.

Jim Andrew then displayed quite a few USA pre-cancels from various US states.

Paul Watkins then showed some very nice and interesting French "Puzzle" Postcards which were very unusual indeed.

Finally, **Nathan Gregory** put up a mixed lot of recently purchased Cigarette Cards ands a stock-book of various International Congress stamps.

Monday 5th February "Heros" There were 12 members present

Brian May started the afternoon and he thought that it was all about Costumes and Trains!!!!! and he showed a sheet of "Austrian Prairies ladies costumes and some nice postcards of various costumes from all over.

John Mills was next and his subject was "Heroes from Ghana". John F Kennedy who was shot by Lee Harvey Oswald and a nice sheet all about Lord Baden Powell and his scouting achievements.

Juliet Keel was next and she showed lots of sheets of Heroes from around the world. Charles Darwin, Emmeline Pankhurst Edith Cavell and data about them, data sheets about Emily Boothe the wife of Albert Einstein, and Marie Curie. She finished with sheets of female authors and data sheets all about Winston Churchill. Where does she get it all from?

Malcolm Hoskins started part 2 and he showed several illustrated VC issues to persons on covers and also of H.U. Singh VC, of the Royal Indian Artillery Nice.

Mike Smith then showed a sheet of Heroes of the Resistance all issued by France.

Dave Tanner was next and he showed data and illustrated sheets of Resistance Heroes Jean Baptiste Lebas and Jean Monk.

Graeme Stewart was the last exhibitor and he showed data on Ernest Shackleton – maps of Antarctica. Peter Ephram with the Nimrod. Graeme spoke about Shackleton and the Antarctic Expeditions ands all about the wrecking of the ship HMS Endeavour and Ross Island.

Thursday 15th "The Gold Coast" with John Mills, 15 members present.

The Gold Coast has the same time as England as the zero meridian passes through it. The first issues were in 1875 and John spoke about them with nice sheets of stamps and covers. He told us about the many forgeries and replicas of the early stamps and the 1864 overprints of the high values that were sent to the U.P.U. He spoke about the Edward VII issues of 1904 and showed lots of sheets about them and also some of the overprints that were issued. John said that he had been collecting Gold Coast stamps for quite some time and had a good collection but there were still many issues that he had to acquire. We all then came to have a look at all the display.

John put up a full display of sheets for part two and spoke about the Silver Jubilee issues and some of the forgeries that were discovered that he displayed. He told us about a chap called Harris who put forgeries on covers and cancelled them himself. John the spoke about the Coronation issues of 1948 that were on display. He ended his talk by telling us all about the 1948 definitive issues of July 1948 and how he had obtained them. Well, what a great display of the issues of just one country.

Monday 4th March "Trains" There were 13 members present

Brian May showed a nice lot of train postcards including one of the Hogwarts Express and then a lovely model train of the LNER. See picture.

Juliet was next and she showed sheets, covers and cards of world stamps from all over. Then some official sheets and Australian franked rail letters and Canadian Express cards and pictures of trains and railways.

Malcolm Hoskins then showed a great selection of stamps and cards and letters all about the Mount Snowdon Railway and Llanberris pass station. Very nice sequence.

Bob Patterson then put up a couple of sheets all about the 1937 Railway Congress that were quite informative.

Then **Jim Andrew** showed us centenary issues of the Bhotswana Railway, an Isle of Man Electric train cover and some nice Turkish Railway cards.

Alan Cross showed us quite a few sheets all about things that went on trains (apart from people!). lots of luggage labels from Australia and all over. Quite a collection.

Martin Farr started part 2 by showing a selection of his "Age of Steam" sheets. The early steam engine inventors, several sheets about the famous Rainhill Trials where the final winner was 'The Rocket' entered by the Stephensons. He finished with several sheets of early American trains, some delivered from England. A very nice display.

John Mills was next and he showed a lots of stamps, sheets, covers and postcards of the Ghana Railway system. Quite an extensive and informative display.

Alan Cross put up some more railway items fro Australia by turning over his original sheets to show their reverse items. What a different way of doing it!

Dave Tanner was next and he showed railway stamps from around the world and some from the Isle of Man belonging to Mrs Margaret Tanner!

Graeme, after several trips out, then showed a good display of cards, letters and photos all about Thatcham and Newbury and their connections with stamps and correspondence. Nice pictures of Thatcham Railway station and lots of letters and cards locally addressed from 1880 to 1949 and some early railway tickets to and from Thatcham. A nice display.


Thursday 21st March "The Curios Case of the Common" by Andy Kempe 17 members present

Andy used a data projector to show all his pictures and information which came out very well. He moved to Newbury in 1982 and some time later joined the Control Tower organisation and helped to revamp it using the National Lottery funding. He showed a great display of pictures and data about the common and its inception which went back for many years. He was quite comical in his speaking which certainly aided the data he was showing. Data on General Eisenhower's visit and also the American Air Force site occupation and the hangars and missile storage. The first plane to drop paratroopers in Normandy actually took off from the Commons air base. The base was 'rebuilt' in 1951and was home to 2,200 personnel. In 1972 the base became the transit camp for the Ugandan refugees and home for the International Air Tattoo of 1973. There were protests all around the Air base in 1980 (remember that) when thousands of protesters (go to P6)




